Removal of Soldiers' Remains.- We learn from the Zanesville (Ohio) Signal that an agent of General Bingham, the chief quartermaster of the department of the lakes, is now in Columbus, attending to the removal of scattered bodies of soldiers, both Union and Confederate, to the principal national cemeteries. The Confederate dead in the city graveyard, 93 in number, and in the burying ground at Camp Dennison, 31 in number, will be removed to the Confederate cemetery at Camp Chase. This will make the number of Confederate dead at Camp Chase something over 2,000, and will concentrate all the Confederate dead buried in Ohio into the two cemeteries – Camp Chase and Governor's Island. (The compiler notes this would be Johnson's Island)
